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got...he's still got time. Send the bill to the bill drafter and run it through the process, but let's not do this unless we want to fall into the trap that Senator Beutler has indicated that we fall into. LB 270, AM2019, which is the victims' rights bill, those have both been worked to the point where, to the best of my flawed human ability, I can tell you they're in shape. They're ready for your action. FA1403 is a bad amendment. It doesn't work. You shouldn't adopt it and we shouldn't spend a lot of time on it just because it's an interesting subject. We aren't in the habit of flawed amendments. I ask you to defeat it. Thank you.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Brashear. Senator Foley, on your amendment.

SENATOR FOLEY: Thank you, Mr. President. A number of points: First, Senator Chambers attempted to bait me by making some disparaging remarks regarding Bishop Bruskewitz, who is the bishop of the Lincoln Diocese, and I know...I know why he does that. He wants to create a brawl. He wants to create a big fight. And it's bait and when I hear the bait I'm...I have to just let it pass, but I can't. In this instance, I have to speak up and I want to put on the public record that I have enormous respect and gratitude to Bishop Fabian Bruskewitz for his work in the Lincoln Diocese, just enormous respect, and I can't remain silent when someone publicly attacks him that...in such an unfair way, when he can't be present here to speak for himself. So let me just put that on the record. Senator Beutler says, well, we can't...we can't do the Foley amendment; it's controversial. Oh, my God! Well, I have the greatest respect for Senator Beutler and only respect for Senator Beutler, but I got to tell you that's a curious argument, that we can't offer a controversial amendment? Senator, that's why we're here, to offer amendments that improve legislation through our three rounds of debate. That's why we're here. Senator Friend spoke to the concept of the flawed law. I'll tell you why the Brashear bill is flawed. Because when we put hate crimes on the books, originally, that was in 1997. Well, some things have happened since 1997. We've added some more laws to our books. We added LB 824 in the year 2002 that makes it a crime to kill an unborn child. That was placed on the books,
