stuff and me, I have reached just about my saturation point. If he doesn't like the bill, vote against it. That's his ability to do so. He can filibuster it, even though if you recall last session it had nothing to do with unborn children. There was some other language he didn't like in the bill. But I've had it...I've about had it with the agenda. I've about had it. Everything is about pro-life. And what I'm afraid of is that Senator Foley will intimidate people on this floor into voting for this amendment that clearly will flaw LB 270 and our hate crime statute, because, by God, if you don't do this, you're not pro-life. That is nonsense. I have reached the saturation point and I'm sorry, Senator Foley, that I have to say that, but not everything is about pro-life/pro-choice. We have other things that we need to deal with here.

SENATOR CUDABACK: One minute.

SENATOR BOURNE: We have a budget deficit of, what, \$220 million, and a whole host of other issues. We have foster kids. We have a huge problem here with our foster kids dying. And I got to tell you, here we are on the fourth, fifth, sixth day, whatever; we've gone through two bills. That's outrageous. We're not going to get to half of the things that we need to here. We're not going to get to a fourth of them because we're mired down in these issues. And again, I urge you to not let this amendment...and Senator Foley somehow branding you that if you vote against this you're not pro-life, because that's nonsense. I'm pro-commonsense. This amendment doesn't fit on this bill and I urge you to reject it. Thank you.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Bourne. Senator Foley.

SENATOR FOLEY: Thank you, Mr. President. Senator Bourne, I wonder if you might yield to a question, because I was distracted just a little bit when you were speaking?

SENATOR CUDABACK: Senator Bourne, would you respond?

SENATOR BOURNE: No.

SENATOR CUDABACK: He would not respond. Senator Foley.
