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amendment and advance...adopt Senator Brashear's amendment, LB (sic) 219. Thank you.

SENATOR CUDABACK: One minute. Thank you, Senator Chambers and Senator Hartnett. Senator Hartnett, your light is next.

SENATOR HARTNETT: I'd call the question.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Senator Hartnett, that won't be necessary because there are no further lights on. Thank you, anyway. I will recognize Senator Foley to close on AM2082, offered by him to the AM2019 of Senator Brashear's to LB 270. Senator Foley, recognized to close.

SENATOR FOLEY: Thank you very much, Mr. President. Let me pick up on a point that Senator Bourne made when he was...had his last speaking turn. He said he objected to the fact that I bring these kinds of amendments over and over and over again, or something to that effect. I'm not sure I'm quoting him precisely, probably not, but that was the gist of what he said. Well, I don't think that's fair at all. I think the members understand I've been here for now my fourth year. These aren't things that come up over and over and over again. We get...there's about one or two pro-life votes a year in this body. That's about all there is, one or two votes a year. Sure, I've brought a couple of bills. They passed overwhelmingly. LB 824 in the year 2002, fetal homicide, I've forgotten what the final vote total was, but I think it was 40 or better. Brought another bill last year, the wrongful death of the unborn child, that was a big vote that year for the whole year. That bill passed. Wasn't it unanimous? Do I remember correctly there was not one red vote on that bill? I think I'm...think I'm correct. Over and over again he says, that's nonsense, with all due respect. That's just wrong. A vote or two a year is not overly taxing. This...pro-life...hey, I got news for you, folks. When you run for this office and you serve in this body, you're going to be voting on pro-life bills once in awhile. I don't choose the order of bills. I'm very grateful to Senator Bromm for scheduling LB 172 as the first bill of the year, very grateful for that, but it wasn't my decision. It wasn't my decision to schedule this bill today.
