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If it had been my decision, I wouldn't have scheduled it. I don't pick and choose the order of bills; the Speaker does. Speaker selected this bill as our third bill of the year. I think everybody in this body knows I fought this bill last year; don't like it. But again, I didn't pick the order. There's been a suggestion here that I'm going to do...I'm going to dominate the session. Well, that's...that's nonsense. That's nonsense. I think most of you know how I operate. I tend to be one of the more quiet members of the body. I sit back, I listen, I study, I ask questions and I vote, and occasionally I'll engage in debate if I think I can be helpful to moving something along. I haven't abused the process here. I've been very fair about all this. I've offered what I think is a very reasonable compromise, very reasonable compromise. Senator Brashear and I talked through a hypothetical about the killing of a child the day after birth versus the day before birth. That's what this amendment addresses. It makes sure that our hate crimes statute, if you so choose to advance this bill, it makes sure that statute is in harmony with previous work overwhelmingly approved by this Legislature. That's what's before us. Senator Bourne, I think one other senator, I've forgotten who it was, suggested maybe the better approach is to offer separate legislation rather than trying to fix this bill. Well, that's a thought. That's a thought. What I may do is take you up on that offer and sit down with Senator Brashear, see if we can't craft something that will take care of my concerns here. I think what I'll do is offer a bracket motion to bracket this bill for a week. That won't kill it. We can come back in a week.

SENATOR CUDABACK: One minute.

SENATOR FOLEY: We'll bracket this bill for a week or so, give us a chance to sit down with Senator Brashear, see if we can find an amendment to this bill. If we can't, I do have the option of offering legislation. There's still time for that. And just to show him that I'm operating in good faith here. I'm not trying to gum up the works. I didn't select this order of bills. It's just the way it happened to work out this year. Mr. President, I'm going to withdraw AM2082 and move to the next motion.
