But also, we have lots of SIDs around my particular...my county, and so forth, and what you're saying is that they would have to get a permit from someone if they were going to have a parade? Is that your intention with this bill? You know, Senator,...

SENATOR AGUILAR: (Inaudible.)

SENATOR CUDABACK: Senator Aguilar.

SENATOR AGUILAR: I think what we've been talking about is that...my assumption that if anybody is going to have a parade, they have to get approval from the city, so that the police department can block off intersections. That's only a common-sense thing. I'm finding out now that some cities don't do that. If that's not the case, then I completely agree with Senator Chambers about the vagueness of what's in there, and we will have to address that.
