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out the absurdity of the law. And as much as I like Senator Aguilar, I'm not going to vote to advance this bill. I'm not going to dig my heels in on General File and just pull out all the stops and do what I can to prevent it from moving, but I'm going to argue against it. Senator Aguilar has had bills in the past with which I disagreed, and on one of them...(laugh) I just thought about it and I got a headache. I spent a whole weekend going through this thing. It was atrocious. I didn't realize what a hard job it was going to be, I seriously didn't, but having promised to do it, I went on and did it. I'm not going to do that with people's legislation anymore. This is what happens when we are trying to enact a piece of legislation to protect young people, but the rural community wants to have exceptions and exemptions so that children can be endangered in their area. Well, when you're going to protect, or try to, children in certain areas, but similarly situated children in other areas are not to be protected, you come up with language that really does neither of the things, in a legal way, that you're trying to do. You could even call this inappropriate class legislation, because certain types of dangerous conduct will be allowed, depending on what part of the state it occurs,...

SENATOR CUDABACK: One minute.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: ...and that should not be. Either this conduct is too dangerous to tolerate for all of our children, or, if it's safe for some children without it being a crime, it should be safe enough for all children to not be a crime. But to make the same conduct a crime on Elm Street and not a crime on Cedar Street is not a rational classification, in my mind. It might be easy to simply put the word "motor" in front of "vehicle" everywhere that it occurs, but that still would not take care of all of the problems. If I were to engage my good friend and foil, Senator--(laugh) he was smiling before I even called his name--Senator Friend, he will agree with this without even standing up, we could argue for 20 minutes about what the word "caravan" means, and both come up with different...

SENATOR CUDABACK: Time.
