PRESIDENT HEINEMAN: Thank you, Senator Kruse. Question is the adoption of AM2144 to LB 208. All those in favor vote aye; those opposed vote nay. Please record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 39 ayes, 0 nays, Mr. President, on the adoption of Senator Kruse's amendment.

PRESIDENT HEINEMAN: The amendment is adopted.

CLERK: I have nothing further on the bill, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT HEINEMAN: Thank you, Mr. Clerk. The Chair would recognize Senator Mossey for a motion.

SENATOR MOSSEY: Mr. Lieutenant Governor, I move the advancement of LB 208 to E & R for engrossing.

PRESIDENT HEINEMAN: Thank you, Senator Mossey. You've heard the motion. The question before the body is the advancement of LB 208. All those in favor please say aye. Those opposed nay. The bill is advanced. Before proceeding to the next item, while the Legislature is in session and capable of transacting business, I propose to sign and do sign LR 203. Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: Mr. President, the first bill on General File this morning, LB 560, a bill introduced by Senator Baker. (Read title.) The bill was introduced on January 21 of this year...or of last year, excuse me, at that time referred to the Transportation and Telecommunications Committee for hearing.
