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bill is to update and harmonize some statutes within the DMV, Chapter...statutes here dealing with titles and registration activities. And it also increases the efficiency of the department, and provides some better service to the public in record procurement, and so on. It also creates a salvage title and abandoned title process for motor boats. And you say, why motor boats? But they've become an issue in the state. They've become more expensive, and we want to parallel the statutes for vehicles and use those also for motor boats. So that's in the bill. And the bill also started out...well, it still contains it, but an increase in certain fees charged for motor vehicle records. Right now, the DMV sells data in two different ways. They'll sell you an individual record, and depending on what that individual record is, it was either \$3 or \$1. It's \$3 for a driving...a certified driving record, and only \$1 for a motor vehicle record. So the bill proposes to change this to...the motor vehicle record to \$3, so that it's the same as a certified driving record. That's on individual records. Now then, the bill also says that we will increase the fee on batch records. Right now it's \$12 per 1,000 records, or...and to \$30, is what the bill increases it to. You'll see on the screen the amendment to work this out with the people who use DMV records on a regular basis. They felt that that was too much of an increase, and so the amendments deal with the increase, getting it back to down to where I think we have everyone on board. So with that, that's the introduction on the bill. And we will flesh this out some with the amendments. Thank you, Mr. Speaker.

PRESIDENT HEINEMAN: Thank you, Senator Baker. The Chair recognizes Senator Baker on the committee amendments.

SENATOR BAKER: Thank you, Mr. President. The committee amendment is AM0329. You'll see there's a series of amendments. But the committee amendment lowers the fee that was proposed in the green copy of the bill from \$30 per 1,000. If somebody comes into the DMV and only wants 1,000 records, that's all they want is 1,000, not 10,000 or more, but 1,000 records, the bill proposed to raise it from \$12, I believe is what it was, to \$30. And the people...we do have a couple companies that operate out of Nebraska that access these records, not just in Nebraska, but
