about the committee amendment right now. I'm talking about the green copy.

SENATOR BAKER: Yes, we did. There's a fairly extensive amendment, AM2177, coming up here.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: And that will be the committee amendment, which is the white copy, as we call it.

SENATOR BAKER: Yes.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: And that constitutes the work done by the committee?

SENATOR BAKER: Yes. It doesn't completely replace the bill, by any means, but it does strike some...or change some sections in it.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Right. And I don't know if anybody is interested, but when I get a white copy of a bill, and rather than replacing the entire bill and all amendments thereto, it eliminates certain sections, I always write the page numbers above the sections that are being eliminated, in order that I can make reference and not discuss something, if I look at the green copy, that has already been eliminated. So if anybody is interested, I'm going to mention the pages now rapidly, just to let you know I've done it. And if you'd like to get those page numbers again, I'll give it...I will give them. The original sections that will be stricken are Sections 6, which is on page 9; 24, which comprises pages 14 through 21; 28 comprises pages 28 through 36; 32 comprises pages 42 and 43; 33 comprises pages 44 through 46; 37 would be page 49; 38 would be page 50. That's about all of the time I...that's about all I could do in the time I've had. But I'm somewhat worried...let me not say worried. I've got to review things that come out of the Transportation Committee after our little experience yesterday. And that's not a slam. It just means that I'm going to offer some motions that will give the opportunity for the Chairman to explain parts of the bill that I have not had the chance to read yet. And as he explains, I will be able to make a determination. When we create an entire and new system
