SENATOR BAKER: Oh, you might possibly.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Well, if there's the possibility, why will you undergo a risk? And let me give an analogy. "Baron" Tyson is not here. He would appreciate this. If I put a pistol to your head and said, your money or your life...there's a possibility the gun is loaded; there's a possibility that it is not...would you calculate the odds and say, since I have a fifty-fifty chance of living and keeping my money, a fifty-fifty chance of dying and losing my money, my money...
