SENATOR CHAMBERS: So now are you going to encourage that movement in the right direction by supporting my amendment?

SENATOR BAKER: Yes, I'll support it.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Then I don't think...Mr. Speaker and members of the Legislature, I want you all to hear that Senator Baker said he would support my amendment so that then I don't have to continue talking, but I don't want to just say it. Senator Baker, did you say you would support this amendment that's before us?

SENATOR BAKER: Yes, I will, FA1417.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Then I am not going to discuss this further. I ask that you support this amendment. And because our numbers are few I may have to ask for a call of the house, but I will wait for that. Now, that's not my closing, because somebody else may want to talk, but I'm saying I don't have any need to discuss it further. Thank you.

SPEAKER BROMM: Thank you, Senator Chambers. I don't see any further lights on your amendment. You are recognized to close, but you are waiving closing? Members, the question before us is the adoption of Senator Chambers' amendment, FA1417, to AM0328. All in favor of the amendment please vote aye, and opposed nay. Please record.

CLERK: 27 ayes, 0 nays, Mr. President, on the adoption of Senator Chambers' amendment to Senator Baker's amendment.

SPEAKER BROMM: The amendment is adopted. We're back to discussion on AM0328, as amended. Senator Chambers.
