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SENATOR CHAMBERS: Okay. Then I will continue, because I can craft some amendments that will give you all the time that you need. In fact, I can give you so much time that you'll be asking me not to give you any more. But when you say not too much, do you mean minutes, hours, or days?

SENATOR BAKER: I think I can agree to it now. We had this figured out. We've got you where we want you.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Right. I'm in full flight.

SENATOR BAKER: (Laugh)

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Since I'm going to discuss a little bit, that will take a few minutes, would you craft the amendment so that it does exactly what we've talked about? Because you know where it's located in the bill. And I will continue my discussion until you give me the high sign and let me know that the amendment is on the desk. And then I will either offer...you can bring me the amendment and I will offer it, so it won't have to look like...

SPEAKER BROMM: One minute.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: ...you're changing or whatever. So let me ask you a question in this one minute. Would you prefer that I offer the amendment after you've drafted it, or do you want to offer it?

SENATOR BAKER: I can offer it. We're going to draw the amendment up. We'll let you look at it, to make sure that you agree it's what you want, before we turn it in.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: I trust you, I really do, and if there's any problem, we can get that on Select File too. But I'm going to put my light on again so there will be the opportunity for you to do that.
