going from embossed plate to the flat plate now. I notice that's one of them. We're changing the length of a sheriff's inspection on a vehicle from just a certificate to now expires in 90 days. That's a change on page 6. And if you just keep going through there, there's hardly any changes to any of this material. In regard to Senator Chambers' concern that we have two Section 34s, one in the green copy, one in the amendment we're dealing with now, those will be renumbered accordingly. You'll find Section 34 in the white copy is Section 33 in the green copy, and that's standard drafting procedure. It's verbatim. It just hasn't been renumbered. If we adopt this amendment, then the bill drafters will go ahead and harmonize that, and it's, as I said, that's standard procedure. Senator Chambers brought it up this morning, but it's nothing new with bill drafting. So I'd be glad to answer any questions. We've discussed this amendment at length already and I would simply ask for its adoption. Thank you.
