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SENATOR CHAMBERS: Mr. President, members of the Legislature, I agree with this amendment, and I'm glad Senator Baker said that we're talking about lines 3 and 4, instead of just line 4. So the amendment should read, on page 39, in lines 3 and 4. Is that right, Senator Baker?

SENATOR CUDABACK: Senator Baker.

SENATOR BAKER: That's correct. Are we going to have to redraft this?

CLERK: If I may, I...if that's your intent, I'll make that modification up here and we'll...

SENATOR BAKER: That's my intent. It should be on lines 3 and 4; reinstate the stricken matter on line 3 and 4.

CLERK: Lines 3 and 4. Okay. Thank you.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: And...

SENATOR CUDABACK: Senator Chambers.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: ...the reason I stood, it was to make that, what I would call, correction, but when Senator Baker stated it, I wanted to be sure that it was done. But now, since I'm on my feet, I want to ask Senator Baker a question,...

SENATOR CUDABACK: Senator Baker, would you...

SENATOR CHAMBERS: ...if he will answer.

SENATOR CUDABACK: ...you respond?

SENATOR BAKER: I will answer.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Senator Baker, would you turn to page 21 of AM2177.

SENATOR BAKER: Yes.
