Revenue Committee's amendment. It reduces the amount of labor and effort that county officials will have to make, and secondly, it merges that data into a usable, searchable database managed by our Property Tax Administrator. Thank you.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Landis. You've heard the opening on the committee amendments. Mr. Clerk, motion on the desk.

ASSISTANT CLERK: Mr. President, Senator Hartnett would move to amend the committee amendments with AM0873. (Legislative Journal page 945, First Session, 2003.)

SENATOR CUDABACK: Senator Hartnett, you're recognized to open on your amendment to the committee amendments.

SENATOR HARTNETT: Mr. President, members of the body, I simplify it more. (Laugh) All that we have left in that the county assessor has to turn in is just the legal descriptions. So we strike the assessed valuation, we strike the amount of taxes due, we do all that. So it just simply makes it, as Senator Landis says, a very short report that the county assessors have to send in. So with that, I would ask for the adoption of my amendment to the committee amendment.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Hartnett. You've heard the opening on AM0873 to the committee amendments to LB 644. Now we're open for discussion. Senator Burling. He waives the opportunity. Senator Hartnett, did you...he did not wish to. Anybody else wish to speak to the Hartnett amendment to the committee amendments? Seeing no lights on, the question before the body is adoption of the Hartnett amendment, AM0873, to the committee amendments. All in favor of that amendment vote aye, opposed nay. We're voting on the Hartnett amendment to the committee amendments to LB 644. Have you all voted who care to? Record please, Mr. Clerk.
