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required to submit with the candidate filing form proof that he or she has attended the Law Enforcement Training Center and received a certificate attesting to the satisfactory completion of those courses. Alternatively then, the candidate could present the proof that he or she has demonstrated to the Police Standards Advisory Council that his or her previous training and education is sufficient to discharge the duties of the office. This still wasn't quite a satisfactory answer. And so what we did over the summer, what the Government Committee did over the summer, is we held a hearing, actually two hearings, on this question. And during the course of that discussion, I think we came up with a compromise that most parties--all parties, as far as I know--thought was satisfactory. And that is the amendment that I will be talking about shortly. So if we could, Mr. Clerk...or Mr. President, I don't know if you intend to go to the amendments next or to the Hudkins amendment next. I think I'll stop there, before I get into the Hudkins amendment, which I filed, actually. But if we could,...

SENATOR CUDABACK: You've heard the...

SENATOR SCHIMEK: ...do we want to take up the standing committee amendments?

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Schimek. You've heard the opening on LB 75. Now, Senator Schimek, as Chairman of...Chairperson of the Government Military Affairs Committee, you're recognized to open on the committee amendments to LB 75.

SENATOR SCHIMEK: And Mr. President, what I would like to say is, I just briefly did explain the committee amendments. And what happens with the committee amendments is that we amend those and get rid of those with the Hudkins amendment. So I'm not sure procedurally what we want to do here. I need to ask counsel if we go ahead and adopt the committee amendments and then amend the committee amendments before or after we adopt.

SENATOR CUDABACK: I'll go to...
