SENATOR CHAMBERS: Oh, so this is the only thing in the bill,...

SENATOR SCHIMEK: This is...

SENATOR CHAMBERS: ...that would be in the bill if you...?

SENATOR SCHIMEK: ...all we really care about as far as the discussion is concerned, I think. Yes.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Well, I'm going to turn off my light for now and check that out.

SENATOR SCHIMEK: Okay.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: I'd spent all of this time, Senator Schimek, reading, going to other statutes, and checking out why people in sparsely populated counties could have somebody who is not qualified be the sheriff, but others...

SENATOR SCHIMEK: Right.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: ...would have certain qualifications to meet. So that's why I'm off the beam on this amendment you're offering now.

SENATOR SCHIMEK: And I understand your concern. It doesn't seem exactly fair. But then, on the other hand, it was kind of a practical matter. Would you ever get anybody to run for county sheriff if they had to get certified ahead of time in these counties with...

SENATOR CUDABACK: One minute.

SENATOR SCHIMEK: ...real small populations?

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Well, will you be able to get anybody to run if he's got to be able to read?
