SENATOR SCHIMEK: (Laugh) Yes, Senator.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: In order that I can understand,...well, I'll put my light on again, because...

SENATOR SCHIMEK: Okay.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: I will look this over.

SENATOR SCHIMEK: Thank you.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Chambers. Senator Brown on the Schimek amendment.

SENATOR BROWN: Mr. President, members, to reiterate some of the things that...some of the points that we just made in the exchange, some of the individuals that Senator Chambers asked about whether they would have to have taken a test, a reading test, prior to being in their office, most of them have some sort an educational requirement. The...for the Chief Justice, they have to be a member of the Bar. So they have already gone through the kind of training and demonstrated some of these abilities prior to aspiring to the office that they are aspiring to. In the case of sheriffs, as we talked about, do you require the person to have the certification prior to coming into it? We do in the case of county attorneys. They must be attorneys. They must have passed the bar prior to going on the ballot as a county attorney. And assessors too. And so it really becomes a question of, do we require for every candidate that they have passed the test prior to putting themselves up for election? If not, then how do we guarantee for the county standpoint that the individuals who are going through have the potential to be able to represent the county as the sheriff? And we wrestled a great deal with it, and we believe that we came up with something. And it was mostly around the issue of not distinguishing, Senator Chambers, between counties below the...below 10,000 and those above, that we arrived at what we have before us in this bill. And I would yield the rest of my time to Senator Schimek.
