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SENATOR SCHIMEK: Yes, Senator. Senator Brown wanted to yield...

SENATOR CUDABACK: Yes.

SENATOR SCHIMEK: ...the rest of her time to me. And I'll just take a minute. But staff reminded me to tell you that...and I want Senator Chambers to hear this, which is the reason that I came up here. I guess, Senator Chambers,--and I wasn't familiar with this--that when an applicant applies for the law enforcement training, at that time they have to take a test to prove that they can...you know, that they have a comprehensive...a comprehension of the English language, et cetera. So it's kind of a pretest for the law enforcement training in the first place. And that's already a part of statute. Okay? Thank you. Thank you, Senator Brown.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Schimek and Senator Brown. Senator Mossey.

SENATOR MOSSEY: Thank you, Mr. President. Will Senator Schimek yield to a question?

SENATOR CUDABACK: Senator,...I'm sorry, Senator Mossey, I did not hear you.

SENATOR MOSSEY: I said, will Senator Schimek yield to a question?

SENATOR CUDABACK: Senator Schimek, would you yield?

SENATOR MOSSEY: Senator Schimek, did I hear something about a population requirement, or was I misunderstanding?

SENATOR SCHIMEK: That is correct, Senator Mossey. That was in the original committee amendment and the bill, I believe, and...or just the committee amendment. We took...take that out in this particular amendment that we're talking about now. So it strikes all of that. So it would apply to all counties.
