SENATOR CUDABACK: One minute.

SENATOR SCHIMEK: Because what we're doing is we're just...we're moving the process up just a little bit, and we're saying, okay, you can run for sheriff if you haven't got the training yet, but you have to take that prequalification test, which lets us know at least you're capable of doing the training.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: And that I'm not worried about. I just want to be sure that we're not exempting some of these people...

SENATOR SCHIMEK: No.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: ...from that ultimate training...

SENATOR SCHIMEK: No.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: ...that is required. Okay.

SENATOR SCHIMEK: No.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: That's what I was still trying to make myself clear on. And now you have clarified. This is why we need more women in positions of authority. Thank you.

SENATOR SCHIMEK: (Laugh) Yes, we're in agreement.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Are you through, Senator Chambers?

SENATOR CHAMBERS: I will be through, yes. Yes.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Okay. Anybody else wishing to speak on AM2221, offered by Senator Schimek to the Government Military Affairs Veterans Committee amendments? Senator McDonald.

SENATOR McDONALD: Mr. Chairman, members of the body, in a lot of rural counties it's very difficult to get someone to run for the position of being a sheriff. And with those requirements, what we're just saying is, that person needs to be to the point that they can be educated enough to at least pass those
