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the issue of out-of-state folks coming to Nebraska, or even a business vehicle driven in Nebraska. I know of one where someone advertises on the side of the business vehicle, number one in the Panhandle, their business, they claim to be number one in the Panhandle, and they drive South Dakota plates. (Laugh) So I believe the need is there. And we can do this pretty simply by not addressing the auto registration renewal, and just addressing the out of state. Thank you, Mr. President.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Smith. You've heard the opening offered by Senator Smith to the committee amendments. Open for discussion. Senator Chambers.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Mr. President, I've got to now ask Senator Smith a question, so I can understand what the procedure is that is being followed here. Senator Smith, when your amendment begins by saying, strike all amendments, what is it talking about?

SENATOR CUDABACK: Senator Smith, would you respond, please?

SENATOR SMITH: I believe it would be striking all of the preceding amendments, should they be adopted.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: And you mean we would be dealing only with the green copy and this amendment that you're offering?

SENATOR SMITH: Yes.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Does your amendment that you're offering here, because I'm just now seeing it, strike this language on pages 5 and 6? Let me back up. The committee amendment strikes language on pages 5 and 6, and replaces it. Would your amendment strike the committee amendment?

SENATOR SMITH: Yes.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Then we would be back to the green copy. Because if the committee amendment were adopted, it would strike this harsh language in the green copy.
