SENATOR CUDABACK: One minute.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: ...the green copy is going to go away. So let's take the committee amendment first.

SENATOR SMITH: Yeah, the committee amendment addresses auto registration renewals, in-state renewals, and I don't want to argue that point today. So I'm wanting to sweep that aside and just address the out-of-state registrations.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: But the schedule of fines, or fees, would remain the same?

SENATOR SMITH: There's no schedule. It's more concise with that language that mirrors Colorado.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Well, not living in Colorado and not being an expert on their law--not being facetious either--what would we be looking at? Because I don't know what Colorado does in this regard.

SENATOR SMITH: There would be a criminal penalty of \$500 and a civil of penalty of up to \$500 as well.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: So then in Nebraska it will be a crime not to have your car registered?

SENATOR SMITH: Yes, as it should be.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: And you thought I was going to support that?

SENATOR SMITH: That was my understanding earlier. Perhaps I was misunderstanding.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Time.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: To make it a crime not to register a vehicle, to make...?

SENATOR CUDABACK: I'm sorry. Time is up, Senator Chambers.
