SENATOR CHAMBERS: Okay. Now, the ten-day grace period was put in there for Nebraskans because I was very interested in having that done, because some people, believe it or not, will let the date when they must register the vehicle slip by. So it was designed to let those people pay everything they've got to in order to be properly registered within ten days of being cited, and then they don't have to be prosecuted. My view...and I'm on your time, but I'm going to make a statement, then ask you a question. My view is that our interest should be in having people register their vehicles, and not have traps for the unwary. If the thing motivating you to bring this legislation is people from out of state who are driving around with the plates from the state they came from, why are Nebraska citizens going to be deprived of a boon that was put in the statute for their purposes? Why do you do that?

SENATOR SMITH: You said a what in the statutes?

SENATOR CUDABACK: One minute.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: A boon, b-o-o-n, a benefit.

SENATOR SMITH: Well, we all should pay the taxes that we owe, Senator Chambers.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Agreed. But there are amnesties even given for people who haven't paid taxes in a long time, aren't there?

SENATOR SMITH: If there aren't currently, I believe there's one proposed this session.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Well, there have been those...you are aware of tax amnesties, where they exist, that allow people who haven't paid taxes in a long time to simply pay their taxes without penalty.

SENATOR SMITH: Right.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Isn't that unfair to the people who have been paying their taxes up to that point, or some who had to pay
