these people would probably try to get a license from that state if they had their vehicle there, even if they came into Nebraska on occasion to do business and part of the time were in this state. Isn't that correct?

SENATOR SMITH: That is correct.

SENATOR VRTISKA: Well, what you're saying, if I understand it correctly, if they're here more...if a majority of their time is spent in this state, then according to this statute they're supposed to buy a license in this state?

SENATOR SMITH: Yes.

SENATOR VRTISKA: Okay. That...I wanted to make sure that I was clear on that, because we all know the people reside in one state and travel to other states and spend a great deal of their time there. And you're not going to penalize them if they're spending more of their time in the state, even though they live here?

SENATOR SMITH: Correct. It's a rebuttable offense. So that would be brought up in that conversation, yes.

SENATOR VRTISKA: Well, I just wanted to make sure I understood it, because I thought, but I wanted to get your words, because I was...it appeared to me that's what you're trying to do. And I don't have a problem with it. I just want to make sure that I'm clear that if somebody lives in this state and operates a great deal of his time out in another state, he can drive on that license plate and not be subject to any kind of a penalty.

SENATOR SMITH: Yes. That is correct.

SENATOR VRTISKA: Okay. That clears up. And I interpreted it that way, but I wanted to make sure that's that what you were alluding to. So with that, I will turn the rest of my time back to the Chair. Thank you.
