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person in this state the same way when it comes to being shielded from criminal sanctions imposed by the state. If Sen...

SENATOR CUDABACK: Time.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Oh.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Chambers. Senator Smith. And this will be your third time, Senator, outside of closing. He waives the opportunity to speak. Senator Cunningham.

SENATOR CUNNINGHAM: Thank you, Mr. President and members. Senator Smith, would you engage in a dialog?

SENATOR CUDABACK: Senator Smith, would you yield?

SENATOR SMITH: Yes.

SENATOR CUNNINGHAM: I'm sorry, I missed the first part of this. I was doing some other business. And you probably discussed this. But in my district, I have cars...people that live in my district, and they have their cars licensed in South Dakota. And the law enforcement there has a terrible time trying to do anything about that. Now, would this bill help that?

SENATOR SMITH: Yes, with a couple corrections, it would.

SENATOR CUNNINGHAM: Okay. And those are the corrections that Senator Chambers was talking about?

SENATOR SMITH: Yes.

SENATOR CUNNINGHAM: Okay. And so if I remember right, previously, the law enforcement had to go to those residences and see that car parked there for ten days in a row, and it was very difficult for them to do that, because the same law enforcement officer wouldn't be on duty every day. They might...you know, they'd take a weekend off, and then it wouldn't count towards the documentation. And it was very difficult. So what would happen...I know you've talked about
