Right now, they're printed for a county, shipped out in a CSI Industries truck. I believe they have their own vehicles. They haul them out to the counties in bulk and, thereby, save a tremendous amount of expense as opposed to sending these plates out in pairs to individuals. I can't even imagine what the fiscal note would look like to send millions of plates through the mail two at a time. It just...that wouldn't work. That would more than offset any potential savings, I think. I'm going to, once again, ask for your support. We need to get this thing moved to the six-year plates. I pledge our support and work to get the bill of Senator Smith's, and if by some chance it doesn't work out this session, certainly get a bill back next session to address the minimal fees that are involved. And the ten-day period of forgiveness, actually, there's a ten-day window in there that you, you're right, Senator Wehrbein is right, we need to change that. We need to get rid of that ten-day period where you don't...aren't assessed any penalty. You can go in and provide proof of new plates to the judge and he says, fine, you've done it; there's no further proceeding. We need to get that changed that we can work on that this session, hopefully, with Senator Smith's bill. And I'm asking that you adopt the committee amendments. We have one other amendment filed dealing with some costs, but that's just a revenue-neutral situation. We need to get this adopted, move on. We'll work on the rest of this, these issues, this session and certainly, if not this session, the next session. With that, I would certainly urge your support of the committee amendments. Thank you.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Baker. Senator Jones.

SENATOR JONES: Mr. President and members of the body, there's been a lot of discussion here in how that we might lose some money on these. The little sticker that you put on each year on the plate, I seen people forget them and don't put them on for three or four months, and they say, whoops, I should a had that done. You go back to the courthouse and get that little sticker; you got to go retroactive back to the day that that thing was due. So they will not lose any tax over this situation. You're not going to skip months. You're not going to skip a whole year. If you wait a whole year, you have got to
