Raise the fee to \$500. And if they still don't do it, make it a felony. And if they still don't do it, life imprisonment. And if, when they get out, because they will be paroled since it was not a crime of violence, suppose they still don't do it? Then there are some on this floor who will say, well, the death penalty. And if they still don't do it, if they happen to get out because their conviction or the sentence is overturned for some reason and they are paroled, they'd say, impose the death penalty, then immediately drive a ten-penny nail through their skull. This Legislature sometimes gets ridiculous and preposterous, and things are not well-thought-out, and I wish Senator Baker wouldn't be the one to bring up all of this kind of stuff. That bill that Senator Smith brought us yesterday came out of the Transportation Committee, and it was all messed up. A lot of messed-up bills are coming out of that committee. I have been put in a position where I have to start paying closer attention to bills that ordinarily I wouldn't even have any interest in. We'll be told by the Chairman of that committee that this is just a cleanup bill. You begin to look at it and you see one thing wrong, another thing wrong. I cannot accept, with confidence, anything out of the Transportation Committee. And before Senator Baker's feelings get hurt...but if they do, that goes along with being Chairperson...I have attacked the Judiciary Committee in the past, a committee of which I'm a member, and my criticisms led to some changes in how business was done by that committee. When people take these positions of leadership, they have to be leaders, and I am not going to have my work made more difficult for me because we get...

SENATOR CUDABACK: One minute.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: ...people who head these committees and they let all kind of trash come out on the floor. Make me the Chairman of every committee, as much work as I have to do anyway. The committees are supposed to winnow this stuff out. Don't bring it all out here. And we're falling into a bad habit now of saying just run it over to Select File and we'll clean it up there. General File is where we're supposed to do the most work, so I'm going to take a much harder line on that kind of argument from now on. There will be situations where it makes
