SENATOR HARTNETT: Okay. I pay the registration fee, and that's the same as the year before.

SENATOR BAKER: Yes,...

SENATOR HARTNETT: The 2006 registration...

SENATOR BAKER: ...and your taxes on your vehicle.

SENATOR HARTNETT: ...is the same as 2005.

SENATOR BAKER: Your taxes on your vehicle and so on, it's all included in the costs.

SENATOR HARTNETT: Yeah. Okay. What of...okay, I do register my car in 2006. I got six years. Then that would be 2011. What if I don't register my car again? What if I'd skip 2007, '08, '09, and I decided then in '10? For not registering...say I decided in 2010 that I want to reregister my car. Do I have to pay the registration fee for those back years?

SENATOR BAKER: I'm assuming you're not driving it, Senator Hartnett.

SENATOR HARTNETT: Oh, no, I'm breaking the law. I'm just...I'm...

SENATOR BAKER: Well, if you get caught, of course,...

SENATOR HARTNETT: ...a hypothetical, not...it's Senator Cunningham, not me. (Laugh) No.

SENATOR BAKER: Okay. Well, if you're breaking the law and get caught, you're going to go to court.

SENATOR HARTNETT: (Laugh) (Inaudible) looking at me.

SENATOR BAKER: But if you're not breaking the law, you have to pay the last year's, that year's, fees, and that's what Senator Wehrbein is talking about, those people, or some of them, taking
