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SENATOR BAKER: They would have to go back and pick up all those back taxes and fees, all of them.

SENATOR PREISTER: How do we know that that happens?

SENATOR BAKER: We have to trust the county treasurers, I guess, that they're actually collecting these, and I have no reason to believe they're not. But it's up to the county treasurer.

SENATOR PREISTER: So, if the county treasurer is monitoring it closely, they may or may not catch it, they may or may not charge somebody.

SENATOR BAKER: I would think they would catch it. It's all now computerized and it should, I'm sure, without checking with DMV, it's going to pop up on the screen that they did not renew their plates for one or two or three prior years.

SENATOR PREISTER: Okay. I really am not sure how that works and I ask because a constituent just contacted me last week, coincidentally that were dealing with this, and had forgotten, just forgot to renew the plate, and somebody else looked at the plate and saw the expired tag and said, do you know you're driving on expired plates, and the person said, no, that's not true, they're due now. They realized then that for a whole year they have been driving on expired plates, unintentionally; never got caught; right away went in because it was the month they were expiring; went in; gave the old registration, two years old, gave it to them; they typed up the new one, gave them the new one, didn't charge them for the year that they hadn't been registered; did do absolutely nothing except issue new plates and give them their new registration. So I wasn't sure if the county had a procedure for tracking and did catch it. Perhaps they do with the new computer system, but this just happened this month. So I'm not sure how they're tracking it or how that's working out, but I share it as an example and am trying to be more educated on this issue myself. If you have any comments on that, feel free to use the rest of my time.
