taxes and fees to get a new registration for their vehicle. They would have to.

SENATOR PREISTER: And if they don't, it's just the county not finding it, not doing the right job.

SENATOR BAKER: Yes, and that goes back to what we've been discussing, a lack of enforcement. I know that it's not a number one priority for law enforcement to pick up...

SENATOR CUDABACK: One minute.

SENATOR BAKER: ...people with expired tags and I'm hoping that county treasurers...I'm sure, I'd have to say they just...there's no way they're going to miss this with the computerized systems they have in their offices now that it wouldn't show up. So they should be doing that and I am assuming they are.

SENATOR PREISTER: Well, it did just get missed and it was just this month of January. Thank you.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Preister. Senator Stuthman.

SENATOR STUTHMAN: Thank you, Mr. President. Members of the body, I've just been in conversation with our county treasurer as far as this is concerned about people that do not relicense their vehicles, get the sticker, do not pay for the registration. For over a year, that instance, if it's just over a year, you pay the registration. You can keep your same license plate, but you have to pay the retro. You have to go back and pick up all of that taxes, just like Senator Baker had just stated. But if it would be lapsed for two years, in a situation like that they would probably reissue you a new plate, so you'd have to buy a new plate. You would not be able to keep the old plate, so you would have that additional \$5 that you would have to pay. But you did miss out...the county did miss out on that registration for that year, but maybe that vehicle wasn't used throughout the year, maybe it was, but that would be up to determination. If the vehicle was utilized during that
