year, that would be the duty of the law enforcement to have ticketed that individual. But in the conversation with the county treasurer, if it's, like, a two-year lapse, they would have probably reissued that plate, that number, or put it on the unused number file, and you would have to purchase the new plate. That's where the other \$5 would have to be paid. So in that duration of three years, there's a possibility that individual could have bought the new plate on the onset for \$5; paid registration for one year, not the registration for the next year. The third year he...it's possible that he would have had to buy a new plate and pay the registration. So in that duration of the three-year plan, he would have bought four plates, which would have been the \$10. So that is the conversation that I had with the county treasurer, and that is the way it is handled in our county. So I thank you, and if anyone has any questions, I'd be willing to try to answer those. Thank you, Mr. President.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Stuthman. Senator Chambers, and this will be your third time.
