SENATOR JONES: Mr. President, members of the body, and I appreciate all this discussion here we've had and I sure hope that we can continue to support this, because we are going to the new plate next year. And a lot of people wanted to know what it looks like. I have one laying on my desk here, if you want to look at it to see what it's going to be for the next six years if we pass this bill. And I think...I think it's going to be...somebody said it's going to cost a lot of money, but a lot of things the people don't realize, if you forget to go in the courthouse or...and get your little tag in there and pay your tax and registration each year, you can go miss that for six or eight months if you don't get caught, but when you do go back to the courthouse it's retroactive. You've got to go back and pay that and pick up all that money that you missed. So it's really not losing revenue if you have to go back and pick up all that money. The only ones that are actually losing revenue is if they completely get away with not even registering each year at all, and I don't know how they could do that. If law enforcement would happen to see you, then you'd have to go back and pick up all that. Even if it's a year or two, you still got to go back and pick it up. So with that, I'd like to have the support on this. So with that, I'll close. Thank you.
