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time offered to them. This is one way where employees can take control of their finances, they can plan for the future, and for the unforeseen possibility when they would have to use the federal FMLA provision that's offered to them, they would have a way to secure their income during the time that they're taking care of an ill family member. So again I thank Senator Price for bringing this to us, and I do support it. And I would return my time to Senator Price, if there's anything she'd like to add.

SENATOR PRICE: Thank you.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Combs. Senator Vrtiska.

SENATOR VRTISKA: Thank you, Mr. President, members of the body. I'd like to ask Senator Price a question, if I could. Senator Price, a question please.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Senator Price, would you yield to a question?

SENATOR PRICE: Yes, I would.

SENATOR VRTISKA: Senator Price, you indicated this has a fiscal note. Did you indicate how much it was?

SENATOR PRICE: According to the fiscal note of February 6, 2003, \$90,000 expenditure and revenue would be short \$21,000. That is for the year 2003-2004.

SENATOR VRTISKA: What's the total then?

SENATOR CUDABACK: Senator Price.

SENATOR VRTISKA: \$135,000, is that right?

SENATOR PRICE: I'm looking here then at 2004-2005, expenditures would be \$79,600 and the loss of revenue would be \$135,000.

SENATOR VRTISKA: And so that's General Fund money that would have to be allocated.
