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addresses some issues in the driver training school statutes. And the bill also left in it removes some archaic references to paper forms of drivers' licenses where we are now using computers and have the new driver's license up. Section 7 remains in the bill. That addresses issues of proper usage of DMV equipment and providing false information to obtain driver's license. And then Section 22 remains pretty much intact. That applies the same conditions to obtaining a state ID card. And that would be my opening and we will get to the real issues when we discuss the committee amendment. Thank you.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Baker. As Chairman of the Transportation Committee, you're recognized to open on the committee amendments to LB 559.

SENATOR BAKER: Thank you, Senator Cudaback. The committee amendment is AM0496. As I said, it takes a major portion of the bill out. AM0496 strikes all of Section 6. That's the section that was regarding confiscation of improper documents when someone was trying to obtain a driver's license. That, as I said, that entire section is taken out of the bill. Section 8 strikes the requirement of having to...I'm sorry. Section 8 provides a license card expiration. It takes that out. We tried to tie the driver's license to expiration of an INS document. That section is taken out in Section 8. And then it also allows an individual to present a valid Nebraska driver's license for identification for issuance of another license without requiring showing an additional form of identification. So the major part of this amendment, it strikes Section 6 completely, the confiscation part of it. The county treasurers did not want to get into that part of the issue after hearing the bill. And then it also changes quite a lot of Section 8. I would be glad to answer any questions on the committee amendment. Thank you.

SENATOR CUDABACK: You've heard the opening on the committee amendments. Open for discussion. Senator Chambers.
