each other. And when we don't agree with each other, our urban counterparts, they don't know who to side with. So I think that's what the problem is and we just need to do a better job of getting together. Thank you.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Cunningham. Senator Kremer.

SENATOR KREMER: Thank you, Mr. President. I would like to continue my dialog with Senator Beutler. But before I start that, I guess I'd like to make a couple of comments, and maybe it's already been clarified that some of the concerns that Senator Chambers had. In the mechanism that quit taking the checkoff area if the fund grew to so much, I think it's really...it's a moot point right now because we're so short. The EPIC Fund is going down the road as fast as it can go and the accelerator to the floor and it's not keeping up now, so we have to put some more fuel in it just to keep it up. So there's no chance of it ever getting clear out ahead so far that we have to trigger that mechanism to quit collecting the checkoff money in order to fulfill our obligations. But the shortfall now, we're just...the proposed bill that's been introduced is only going to make up the amount that we know that we're going to need. And so there is still uncertainty on some other ones. So, Senator Beutler, if you would like to dialog with me a little more, I'd be willing to. Senator Beutler, a question?

SENATOR CUDABACK: Senator Beutler, would you respond?

SENATOR BEUTLER: Senator Cudaback, Senator Kremer, thank you very much. Let me back up just a step, as I understand it now there are four plants that we anticipate funding out of the current program, and then with respect to this question of what's described on the floor here as a movable still, how many of them are in play here with respect to the use of current funds? Are there...is there one more or two more or...?

SENATOR KREMER: That are looking at maybe coming in at lesser amounts, you mean; that we've heard that there may be six more that have maybe changed their application from 30 million to 100,000 gallon plant that maybe could qualify somewhat less and
