SENATOR CONNEALY: It's Revenue's language, and the way I understand it, the start date has to be by the end of June in this year, but then the date...the production time can be past that. So it has to...it could be before, which it would have been with Plainview and would have been with Axtell, but it could be the last day of the month in June in 2004,...

SENATOR CONNEALY: ...as the beginning of the 30 days. But what this does is it makes sure that they don't just produce for one day 800 gallons which would be extrapolated out to a year's production. They have to produce on a continuous basis, starting within...at least by the last day of June of this year, to qualify for the beginning of the incentive program, and then
