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using Nebraska workers. As far as I'm concerned, they've turned their backs on us. I truly believe that, and I think that's wrong.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Time.

SENATOR BOURNE: And that is the purpose of this amendment. If they would do what I think is the right thing, even allow Nebraska people to bid on these,...

SENATOR CUDABACK: Time, Senator Bourne.

SENATOR BOURNE: ...we wouldn't be talking here this morning about this amendment.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you. Thank you, Senator Cunningham. Senator Chambers, followed by Senators Hartnett, Connealy, Schrock, Stuthman.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Mr. President, members of the Legislature, behold, I bring you good tidings of great joy which shall be unto all people, but not really. That batch of cattle in which the one was found that had BSE has turned up 19, 19 infected with BSE from Alberta, Canada, ultimately. People need to pay attention. And the question I ask is like that commercial where's the beef, meaning what is the location of the meat from those animals and which parts were sold for consumption in this country? I'm not going to go into that at length this morning. I'm in agreement with what Senator Bourne is pressing for. I hear people say that it would be difficult for the Department of Revenue to make certain determinations. Brothers and sisters, that's what they're paid for. They can do it if they try. It's not that difficult, I assure you. But since Senator Bourne is on a roll, I would like to ask him a question. Senator Bourne, would you like some additional time?

SENATOR BOURNE: Senator Chambers, I'd appreciate that.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Thank you. Mr. Speaker. Mr. Speaker, I yield the remainder of my time to Senator Bourne.
