SPEAKER BROMM: I'm sorry, I couldn't hear you.

SENATOR SCHROCK: Yes, I did, but he didn't want it.

SPEAKER BROMM: Okay. Thank you. Senator Stuthman, your light is next.

SENATOR STUTHMAN: Thank you, Mr. Speaker and members of the body. I have been listening to the discussion all morning and haven't been able to talk on this subject yet. One other thing that concerns me is when we're discussing, you know, these contractors coming in from other states and doing it and bringing the majority of their people along, you know, to build these plants. I totally disagree with that, because they really bring their head people along that move with the contractor and the construction group. But they hire local people. If they don't get local people, they get them from as close as they can get them. When we built our plant there in Columbus, the majority of the people were local people, but there were some that did travel, you know, 50 or 75 or maybe 100 miles to work at the plant. These people that stayed in the motels, you know, were reimbursed for that. It was an economic improvement for our community. A lot of the people spent the majority of their checks in our local establishments, the workers that were there, the type of individuals that were working in the contracting. So I think realistically it should not enter in, into the equation, whether they bring the people in or not. In Columbus, in our area, we did not have the people to work at the plant there. The majority of our people are employed at the plants already that are in other plants around the community, and it really did pull a real hardship on them as their ability to hire people on the construction site. Some of the neighbors did work there, but it was a real burden for them. So I think...I think no matter what, if the people come in, they'll try to get them as close as possible, because otherwise they do have to pay for meals, for lodging for these individuals. So I think in our instance it did not make a lot of difference whether the people came in or didn't. They tried to get them from as close as possible. I do know that the management of the contractor did follow the construction. So those are my comments. Thank you.
