the time. And again, the reason I asked Senator Cunningham to give me the rest of his time is, again, I just want to make clear what I'm going to ask you to do. I'm going to ask you to vote against AM2150. Then, after Senator Schrock's bill (sic), I don't know if he's intending to withdraw that or run it, I don't know, but I'm going to withdraw the next amendment on line, AM1611, and replace it with AM2251, and AM2251 will delete the corn checkoff, it will delete the General Fund appropriation, but it will retain the Nebraska worker...I don't even want to say preference. It will just retain the Nebraska worker protection provision, I think is probably the best word. Because, as Senator Engel mentioned, Senator Cunningham mentioned, this does not require an ethanol...a plant manufacturer to use Nebraska people. It simply opens the door to allow that Nebraska contractor to bid. I think Senator Chambers made some very good points when he talks about the speculators, but I think we need to clarify who the speculators are, or what exactly that means. What happens now, as I understand it, there's an individual based in Minnesota, and this individual will...he specializes in building ethanol plants. He comes down. Say the city of Trenton or Plainview, let's go with Plainview, wants to build an ethanol facility. They get together kind of a consortium, a group of farmers, probably corn farmers, that may benefit from the production of ethanol, which is fair. That's fine. And this individual will come down from Minnesota and he will say, hey, I will help you get your financing, because it does take millions of dollars to build one of these plants; I'll help you get your permitting. And, as Senator Smith mentioned, it is an arduous process to get the permits, as it should be. When you talk about clean air, it sounds like they do emit some pollutions and this has to be done properly. That makes sense. So it's difficult to get a permit, and so he helps them do that. Well, then, when it comes time to build the plant, he already has a construction company that will come in and will build the plant. Well, that's what Senator Chambers means when he talks about speculators getting rich. In my opinion, the only people getting rich off of this incentive program, getting rich off the Nebraska taxpayers' money, is the people that build these plants. It's not the farmers, because, while you might see, locally, you might see some corn price increases, Senator Kremer himself said that there's
