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SENATOR BOURNE: Exactly. And I'll tell you quite honestly, if the...the producer has to demonstrate that no comparable bid was submitted. And I think that would be pretty easy to do.

SENATOR KREMER: Okay.

SENATOR BOURNE: They would have to say, okay, it's a grain-burning machine, or something. I don't even know what it would be. They could say...they could prove pretty easily that there isn't a Nebraska-based contractor that could build such a machine. And once they show that to the Department of Revenue and the Department of Revenue is satisfied, then the credits will be awarded.

SENATOR KREMER: Okay. Thank you very much. And I support your amendment. I think it's very important that we are using Nebraska companies as much as possible. And I checked with one being built in my district, and they...you know, maybe they need to have done a better job, but they are using quite a number of contractors from...

SENATOR CUDABACK: One minute.

SENATOR KREMER: ...Nebraska. I know that all the dirt work was completely done by a contractor just not too many miles from where the plant is being built. So I think it's very important, as just economic development, that we use Nebraska facilities as much as possible. And I think, the way you've stated it, that that would meet my concerns. So thank you. I do support your amendment.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Kremer. Senator Schrock, on the Bourne amendment.

SENATOR SCHROCK: Mr. President, members of the body. Senator Bourne, would you answer a few questions?

SENATOR CUDABACK: Senator Bourne, would you respond to a question from Senator Schrock?

SENATOR BOURNE: Certainly.
