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to remain at a half-cent. If we adopt Senator Bourne's amendment, the checkoff remains at a half a cent. In the committee amendment, it was raised to, I think it was a penny...no, three-quarters of a cent. So that remains the same. I...the only difference between Senator Bourne's amendment--and I know he's said this on his opening--but the only difference is, his amendment leaves his language in dealing with labor stipulations, requirements, contract letting, and the rest of it is the same as mine. So I support that part of it wholly. It does not change the checkoff from what the...my amendment did. And it also leaves the requirements and stipulations of qualifying in there that was in Senator Kremer's bill. So, wanted to clarify that. Thank you.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Baker. Senator Stuhr.

SENATOR STUHR: Thank you, Mr. President and members of the body. Up front, I do want to tell Senator Bourne that I will be supporting this amendment. I, too, believe that it's important to keep money that is generated in Nebraska and to use these workers. I do have a question that I would like to address to Senator Bourne.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Senator...

SENATOR STUHR: Bourne.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Senator Bourne, would you respond?

SENATOR BOURNE: Yes.

SENATOR STUHR: On lines 18-19, when it talks about that this producer shall demonstrate to the satisfaction of the Department of Revenue, is the Department of Revenue going to be setting up some standards, or...I just want something for the record, so that we can have some clarification on that.

SENATOR BOURNE: Sure. Thank you for your question, Senator Stuhr. You know, we had some discussion about this yesterday.

SENATOR STUHR: Yes.
