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SENATOR CHAMBERS: And it's called the High Plains?

SENATOR STUHR: It's changed the name now.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: But it used to be called High Plains?

SENATOR STUHR: Yes, it used to be.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Could it have been because of Clint Eastwood's movie High Plains Drifter, and they didn't want to get the idea that their plant was drifting from one place to another? But here's the question I want to ask you. How long has this plant been operating in York, roughly? Is it a matter of years?

SENATOR STUHR: Yes, yes, yes.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Okay. And...

SENATOR STUHR: Seven, eight years.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Are you aware of whether or not...first of all, are there corn producers in and around the area or region of York?

SENATOR STUHR: Yes.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Is that the source of the corn used by this plant?

SENATOR STUHR: Yes, it is. I mean, one of the main sources, yes. I don't know if they have to bring in from anywhere else, but I know that they have a contract with our local co-op. So yes, it is.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Thank you. I'd now like to ask Senator Baker a question.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Senator Baker, would you respond to a question?
