So I am a representative of the people and their interests in this state, and not representing the people in Iowa, nor the people in Kansas. On the one hand, ...thanks, that's all I will ask you, because you may want to sit down and gather yourself together. We're now in an area where I can make a few comments, because it seems clear to me that Senator Bourne's amendment...

SENATOR CUDABACK: Your time is up, Senator Chambers.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: ...is going to be adopted. Oh, thank you, Mr. President.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Chambers. Senator Wehrbein, on the Bourne amendment, followed by Senator Chambers.

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: Mr. Speaker and members of the body, I just have to get into this a little bit. Senator Chambers, I can't remember the exact numbers, but I think it's about 1 cent per 100 million bushel, the impact of corn. I may be a little off on that, but there is definitely a relationship nationally and globally in the price of corn. And just two weeks ago, ten days ago, we had a movement of about 164 million bushel in terms of lower production and increased usage, which all translated in a sudden jump in the corn market of 20 cents. So this is a global market, and it's certainly a United States market, and so this has an impact on whether we take 100 million or 200 million or 300 million or 400 million or 500 million bushel off of the market, wherever it be in this United States. It has an impact all across the country. So it is not a Nebraska issue; it is a...minimally, a regional issue, if not, once I say again, global issue.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Wehrbein. Senator Chambers, you're recognized.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Mr. President, members of the Legislature, I want to thank Senator Wehrbein for making my case. I would like to ask Senator Wehrbein a question to make sure that I am not misrepresenting his statement.
