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an impact on the corn market nationally, for sure regionally, and perhaps globally. Why do my colleagues halt and hesitate? Senator Baker said he has friends in Kansas. I'd like to ask Senator Baker a question.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Senator Baker, would you respond?

SENATOR BAKER: Yes.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Senator Baker, did I understand you correctly to say that you have friends in Kansas?

SENATOR BAKER: Yes, I think I do yet today.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Do you...when you took an oath to uphold the constitution and laws of the state, which state were you uttering your oath with reference to?

SENATOR BAKER: Nebraska.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: So you don't represent Kansas people, right?

SENATOR BAKER: No.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: But when we get beyond your status as a senator, there is so much giving and compassion in you that you are...

SENATOR CUDABACK: One minute.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: ...of a mind to look out for your Kansas friends. Is that true?

SENATOR BAKER: I live right on the border, and to be honest with you, an awfully lot of Nebraska farmers also produce a lot of grain in Kansas, so they...you know, some of my constituents are Kansas producers, actually. I know it complicates things a little bit, but they can produce in both states, actually, some of them, three states.
