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SENATOR SCHROCK: Yes, we do.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: They just sign a paper and say, I won't do it.

SENATOR SCHROCK: Yes, and I'm sure if you're somebody producing meat and bonemeal, you're not wanting to sell that right now either, so.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: But before more attention was focused, all we had by way of a check and balance was that producers and these feeders would say that they are not going to use feed that contains animal by-products, and that's all. We don't have inspectors going around to make sure that's the case. Isn't that true?

SENATOR SCHROCK: That's true,...

SENATOR CHAMBERS: We trust them, in other words.

SENATOR SCHROCK: Yes, we do.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Well, why don't we trust these...of course, you know producers of corn in Nebraska better than I do, and the ones who operate elevators. Are you saying that they're not trustworthy?

SENATOR SCHROCK: No, they'd be trustworthy, but I just don't know how they would account for it.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Just take their word for it.

SENATOR SCHROCK: Okay, it works for me, then.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: If I offer an amendment like that on Select File, would you give it consideration, and between now and then, if there's some way you can give me something other than...and when I say "just your opinion," I don't mean it's not worth anything, but I'm saying it's not enough to persuade me that the idea is not feasible. I will not offer an amendment like that on General File. And I'm trying to be collegial with Senator
