Baker to find a way to get me out of the way so this bill can move from General to Select File. But since you gave me the time, I will tell you that I'm going to explore that notion, because I am...did you yield your time to me, or is...

SENATOR SCHROCK: Yes, yes. No.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Okay, then I'm not going to ask you any more questions. But I want to make the statements now, so it won't seem like I'm making them and directing them to Senator Schrock. I'm fed up with...

SENATOR CUDABACK: One minute.

SENATOR SCHROCK: ...the ethanol boondoggle. If the state is going to continue in this shell game, ensuring profit and success to these speculators and these multinational corporations, there has to be some way we can put something into this law that is going to guarantee a degree of benefit to the product producers, the corn growers in this state. And all I've seen so far is a checkoff system that takes from them to support the big shots. So I'm not giving up on this idea, although I will not offer it on General File. Thank you, Mr. President, and thank you...

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Schrock and Senator Chambers. (Visitor introduced.) On with discussion, Senator Bourne. I'm sorry, your light went off. There are no further lights on. Senator Bourne, you're recognized to close, if you care to, on your amendment.

SENATOR BOURNE: Thank you, Mr. President, members. I appreciate the discussion we have had this morning. Again, this amendment is very similar to the amendment that Senator Baker ran yesterday; it was defeated. It eliminates the new checkoff for corn and grain sorghum. It eliminates the new General Fund appropriation. However, it retains the language in there that protects Nebraska workers. It allows Nebraska people to bid on these plants. And I would just appreciate your support for AM2251. Thank you.
