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SENATOR CUNNINGHAM: Thank you, Senator Cudaback and members. I've got the results, the estimated economic effects for the Husker Ag ethanol plant at Plainview, Nebraska. Economic Development Department and the Nebraska Public Power District prepared this. Employment effects, they have 31 employees. When the secondary employment effects are added, the total employment effects for Husker Ag comes up to 104.4 jobs including the 31 direct jobs and 73.4 secondary jobs. The employment in the Husker Ag ethanol facility results in the direct addition of \$1,426,000 in labor income, including benefits. The total income effects are derived using the multiplier effects from the IMPLAN input-output model and that they are estimated to be at \$4,423,800. This represents the estimate of total annual income effects in the study area including the direct and secondary labor income plus other property type income stated in constant dollars. Okay, total output effects, the total value of output directly associated with the Husker Ag facility is reported to be \$34,510,000 annually. When the secondary output effects are added to this direct output component, the total output effects associated with the facility are estimated to be \$46,196,400. The ag ethanol facility is estimated for retail sales effects at \$1,144,480. Supposed to increase the price of the corn in the area, 4.83 cents per bushel. So there is many figures in here. I haven't had time to study them, Senator Chambers, but they are here. It does play a very, very major role in my area of the state. And I want to stress that this is a small ethanol plant in comparison to many of the others that are in Nebraska, so ethanol plays a big, big part for us. Thank you.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Senator Chambers, and this will be your third time.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Yes. Thank you, Mr. President. I must ask Senator Cunningham some questions.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Senator.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Senator Cunningham, what are these secondary employment effects or whatever the terminology was? Does that mean that the people work at the ethanol plant and then they get
