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it. So I'm going to vote for this committee amendment because it constitutes a restriction on certain activities. I want to comment on what Senator Schmit has said in the paper he is doing, and that's advising his clients to get under the limbo bar before the bar comes flush with the ground and they can no longer get under that bar. There was a judge who made a comment about these big shots who used every tax shelter, dodge, everything available under the law to avoid paying taxes and some not only pay no taxes but they have some kind of credits. Do you know what that judge said? No person, whether rich or poor, is required under the law to pay more in taxes than the law actually requires. So whether people like these big shots being able to hire lawyers and wind up paying no taxes at all, if the law allows it, they can do it. If what Senator Schmit is advising his clients to do might seem sleazy, Senator Schmit is hired to do that. They hired him to turn over every rock, to explore every nook and every cranny, look behind every tree, Senator Connealy, whether that tree is in a metropolitan area, a Class I city, a village or hamlet, and find a way to gain some money out of the public trough through the production of ethanol. And if the law is written in such a way that that is allowed, then Senator Schmit has done nothing illegal nor have his clients. They hired somebody who knows how to find a way to beat the system.

SENATOR CUDABACK: One minute.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: But not every beating of the system is unlawful, immoral, or wrongful in any way. The Legislature needs to do a better job when it starts creating these giveaway programs, and I'm glad that somebody can rub it in the face of the Legislature and show how shortsighted and simpleminded the Legislature was in enacting the laws that are on the books now. I say more power to Senator Schmit and he ought to increase his operation by 30 people so they can contact more people and tell them, get under the limbo bar before it is laid on the ground and you get some of that public money that the Legislature is so eager to just give away. Thank you, Mr. President.
