SENATOR SMITH: I would say both, Senator Chambers. I view this as a secular matter. And looking at...

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Well, when you say both, you mean both are found in the same person, or both categories of persons?

SENATOR SMITH: Both categories of persons.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Why would you have to discuss it with religious people?

SENATOR SMITH: I would say that's coincidental. Because someone registers their opinion with me, I don't ask them exactly why they're coming to me, Senator Chambers.

SENATOR SMITH: Yes. And I don't disqualify them because they hold a religious belief.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: When we were dealing with your bill the other day to treat out-of-state violators of the motor vehicle laws differently from in-state violators, did you discuss that with religious people?

SENATOR SMITH: I've discussed that with a lot of people who hold a faith, I'm sure. But again, I just didn't happen to consider that.
