SENATOR CUDABACK: One minute.

SENATOR SMITH: ...therapies and treatments relating to Alzheimer's. There are advancements being made using research and efforts that there's no dispute over because it doesn't involve the artificial production of a human embryo. Stem cell research, why medicine should reject human cloning. There are all sorts of names up there, with lots of letters following their name: M.D., Ph.D., M.A. Nowhere do I see a Master of Divinity or a Doctor of Divinity, so it's not a religious issue. This is very secular when it says that the contention from the Center of Bioethics and Human Dignity, associated with the Mayo Clinic--again, the Mayo Clinic, kind of a common medical source of information and treatment--but our contention is that human cloning should not be permitted, whether for research or reproductive purposes. While we enthusiastically affirm the...

SENATOR CUDABACK: Time.

SENATOR SMITH: ...importance of medical research,...they go on to say that we believe human cloning should not occur. Thank you.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Smith and Senator Pedersen. Senator Johnson, followed by 15 others. Senator Johnson, are you on the floor?

SENATOR JOHNSON: I misunderstood the order that you had, Mr. President. Thank you. Well, let's talk...I want to answer a couple of statements that Senator Smith just said. And we'll get into one in a little bit about the, quote, embryo farms, because I think that's kind of an important thing that we talk about here this morning. It's one of those terms that is used to excite people, that we are going to have embryos around and we can cut off this piece or that organ or whatever, and implant it on this individual or whatever. We'll talk about that in a second. But I want to get back just a little bit here to this idea of looking at things in a multicentric way. In other words, let's look at problems in more than one way. I'm curious
